Pastor's Perspective

Now that it's really starting to look and feel like winter, I am glad for the warmth and fellowship that the church provides. In this season of Epiphany, when we celebrate the light of Christ, there are many ways that we, as a church, are sharing that light.

The service of thanksgiving and celebration of Peggy Wight's life reflected Peggy's spirit and the light that she was to so many. Peggy's love of family, camp/lake, and church shone through everything as did her abundant faith.

This past Friday, we hosted a book reading event and potluck with Heidi Bullen and Lisa Wentzell who read from their book A Dog and his Boy: The Adventures of Spillway and Scotty. The book is about a real-life young adult, Scotty, and the physical and developmental challenges he has faced and how his stuffed dog, Spillway, has been his companion through it all. Scotty and Spillway were with us for the event and we could see the light and love of life and people that Scotty has and demonstrates with his hugs and fist-bumps. There were many people of all ages from the wider community at the event and it was great to put our church's welcome and inclusivity front and center.

Through our retreats and small group coaching and consulting this past Fall, we learned about the importance of partnering with community groups and ministering to people where they are. We are hoping to do this in a couple of ways this winter. First, we are asking people to help with food for the Bethel Outing Club and Gould's Wednesday Night Lights Skiing at Pine Hill for children and their families. Last fall, the congregation tried to imagine a number of scenarios that could happen in the future of West Parish Congregational Church. Some – like the breakfast communion service – have actually taken place as a result of these imaginings. Others are percolating up through the energies and actions of folks that were part of the Small Church Leadership group sponsored by the BTS Center, and some that have worked with Paul Nickerson on community outreach. One idea that has been slowly incubating is the establishment of a Teen Drop-In Center – The Green Café – to be run in the basement of the church. Henrietta List and Rev. Dr. Tim LeConey have met with the Interact group at Telstar High School. They are very interested in working with the church to establish this Center. So far only very small steps are being taken. It is being proposed that the Café be open only one afternoon a week. The Interact students are expressed interest in using the space to relax and chat, to learn crafts – knitting and sewing in particular -- to do art, to sell their artwork, to listen to music and perhaps to do some theater. We are hoping to have our first gathering in March. We will keep you posted on the progress of this idea. Please keep this work and its growth in your prayers.
